It aims to strengthen national and regional capabilities in infectious disease surveillance, inter-regional collaboration, outbreak response and information sharing for rapidly and effectively control Public Health Threat.




MBDS is proud to be a part of regional capacity building activity in 2nd Regional Infodemic Management Training. This activity is organized by the Office of International Cooperation (OIC), the Department of Disease Control, Ministry of Public Health, Thailand in collaboration with the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (GIZ), WHO and ASEAN member states. The type of training is hybrid model, start with virtual training which has been conducted on 14, 16 and 29 November 2023 and in-person training on 21-23 November 2023 in Pattaya, Thailand


Risk Assessment: Training Guidelines for Public Health Threats

This technical handbook is a gold mine for health officials and professionals who would like to reduce and contain the public health threats encountered in the respective countries. It covers the whole gamut of systematically doing risk assessments for existing and emerging public health threats in the countries. The threats are present in different degrees of seriousness in every country. The activities proposed for consideration in the handbook will unearth all these vividly. One notable fact is the basic principles of the epidemic intelligence process and the types and models of risk assessment are clearly mentioned. All the steps involved, starting from planning and preparation to risk management and communication, are explicitly explained. Monitoring and evaluation aspects are also included.

This handbook could be a supportive building block for international health regulations (2005) for the countries. The stakeholders and relevant entities in the member states might consider how to implement the proposed ideas mentioned in the document. It is also important to carefully consider for further action the findings of the risk assessment made in the member states. All in all, this is one of the essential documents in the arena of disease prevention and control. I would like to profusely congratulate the MBDS secretariat and all the professionals who prepared the document.
